1 DELEGATION,

There were no delegations.

Mayor Abbass welcomed to the Council Chambers, Kenn Oliver, the new Editor with *The Labradorian* newspaper.

2 ADOPTION OF AGENDA OF THE 18th MEETING

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Stan Oliver seconded by Councillor P. Tsibidis to adopt the agenda of the 18th meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay as presented. Motion Carried unanimously.

3 ADOPTION OF MINUTES OF 17th MEETING

It was moved by Councillor P. Tsibidis seconded by Councillor J. Saunders to approve the adoption of the minutes of the 17th meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay as amended. Motion Carried unanimously.

4 ACTION REPORT

- a) Mayor Abbass queried 4(a) 17th minutes as to whether a meeting has been arranged with Destination Labrador. The Town Manager advised that a meeting will be arranged in the New Year.
- b) Councillor Saunders queried 6(e) 17th minutes as to the ruling obtained from Municipal Affairs concerning Conflict of Interest. The Town Manager advised that they

advised that Councillor Kelly would not be in a Conflict of Interest on the Labrador School Board's request to council concerning their property in Spruce Park.

- c) Councillor Saunders queried 6(k) 17th minutes as to when a meeting would be set with the Nunatsiavut Government on this topic. The Mayor requested that Councillor Saunders go ahead and set up a meeting on this topic in the New Year.

5 CORRESPONDENCE

There were 8 Incoming Letters and 17 Outgoing Letters in the Council Package.

- a) Councillor Kelly queried Incoming Letter #4 and the Town Manager advised that this issue has now been settled.
- b) Mayor Abbass commented on Incoming Letter #2 from the Métis Nation.
- c) Mayor Abbass presented a book he received from INCO titled *Nickel on the Big Land*.
- d) Mayor Abbass commented on the 21st Annual Christmas Carol service he recently took part in. He requested a letter under his signature be prepared for Rev. Matthew Lucas as he will be leaving the area in the near future.

6 MUNICIPAL SERVICES COMMITTEE – Councillor James H. Saunders

It was moved by Councillor J. Saunders seconded by Councillor M. Kelly to adopt the Municipal Services Report as presented. Motion Carried unanimously.

a) **Permit Report**

Permit Report to December 12, 2006 was enclosed for information.

b) **Land Application – Amanda Fudge**

Application received from Amanda Fudge for Crown Land 30 x 60 m on Lake Crescent in Spruce Park for the use of residential. Committee recommends denying the request due to the site currently being zoned as Public and not Residential.

c) **Land Application – Franz Mene**

Application received from Franz Mene for Crown Land 65 x 50 m on Lake Crescent in Spruce Park for the use

of residential. Committee recommends denying the request due to the site currently being zoned as Public and not Residential.

d) **Request – Mokami Status of Women Council**

Request received from Mokami Status of Women Council to have a building 20 x 52 feet placed on their lot located at 1 Kessessassiou Street. Committee recommends approving the request in principal subject to the following conditions: a) approval from Government Services for Fire, Life Safety and Accessibility, and, b) the site plan to be submitted and approved prior to the building being placed on the lot and, c) that the building is placed on a permanent foundation.

e) **Johnny Hill Phase 2**

Request received from Labrador Construction (Tundra Properties) to develop the second phase of Johnny Hill Subdivision. Committee recommends that Council approve the request subject to the following condition: a) 10% of the selling price per lot is to be paid to the Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay once each lot is sold, and b) Town staff to meet with Labrador Construction to discuss the development in regards to the number of lots, road requirements, water and sewer requirement and the phasing approach before construction begins.

f) **Demolition – Perrault Place**

Enclosed in Council's package was information from NLHC regarding the demolition of Perrault Place.

g) **ACAP Meeting Minutes**

Enclosed in Council's package were the minutes of the ACAP workshop held on October 25, 2006.

h) **Water Distribution Assessment Report**

Enclosed in Council's package was a water distribution assessment report from Fracflow Consultants Inc.

i) **Metering**

Committee recommends that a meeting be set up in the New Year to review the Water Distribution Assessment Report from Fracflow Consultants Inc.

j) **Information – Nunatsiavut Government**

Enclosed in Council's package was information from the Nunatsiavut Government regarding health and the environment. Committee recommends that Council

arrange a meeting with the Nunatsiavut Government to discuss services.

k) **Pine Tree Quarry**

l) **Taxi Regulation**

Committee recommends that the Taxi Regulations item 3 be amended to include 3(a) *“any person who violates Section 3 will have their taxi drivers licences suspended 30 days for a first offence, 60 days for a second offence, and indefinite for third offence. In the event a person does not hold a taxi drivers licence the vehicle license will be suspended and the same penalties will apply.”*

a) **Happy Valley-Goose Bay Youth Centre**

Committee recommends that Council rescind motion made at the 3^d Council meeting held on October 30, 2001:

“moved by Councillor M. Kelly seconded by Deputy Mayor L. Abbass that insurance funds from the old town garage in the amount of \$75,000 be ear marked to the youth in the development of building and furnishing for a youth centre.”

b) **Consultant**

Committee recommends that Council engage Morneau Sobeco, a pension plan specialist to review the town's pension plan and advise on the future.

c) **Water and Sewer Charges**

Committee recommends that Council charge a fee of \$350.00 per year on owned or leased serviced vacant land effective January 1, 2007. These rates will be advertised on the rollup and on the town's web site.

d) **Service Charge**

Committee recommends that Council reduce the service charge for two (2) percent to one (1) percent per month commencing January 2007.

e) **Request for Funding**

Request received from Mushuau Innu, Natuashish to assist with enabling their youth to interact with NL youth in hockey tournaments, etc. Committee recommends denying this request as it does not comply with our donation policy.

f) Request – Big Land Challenge Dog Team Race

Request received from the Big Land Challenge Dog Team Race Committee to cover the liability insurance for the race and all events under the SnoBreak banner. Committee recommends referring back to the Finance and Administration Committee for more information.

i) Approval to Borrow – Sewer Treatment Plant

Committee recommends that Council borrow from the Royal Bank of Canada \$90,000.00 plus interest for the sewage treatment plant study. This represents the first borrowing authorization on a \$158,082.00 Provincial government share.
