1 **DELEGATION, Herb Brown**

6 **MUNICIPAL SERVICES COMMITTEE – Councillor James H. Saunders**

- c. town to determine where water and sewer connections are to be terminated
- d. town to rescind original motion by council to have this land rezoned from residential to open space [item 7(aa) of the May 22, 1997 minutes]
- e. this is to be a single low density residential lot only and not to be subdivided in the future.
